Methodology for Floor Cleaning

Cleaning tools used

Broom and Dustpan



- ✓ Ideal for removing heavier dirt or debris that cannot be handled by a vacuum cleaner
- ✓ Recommended for situations where there is no power outlet available at the location
- ✗ Does not ensure cleaning of hard-to-reach areas (such as shelf bases or behind shelves)



Vacuum Cleaner



- ✓ Ensures cleaning of hard-to-reach areas (such as shelf bases and behind shelves)
- ✓ Faster and more effective cleaning
- ✗ Depends on having a power outlet available at the location



Lightly damp mop

- ✓ Microfiber models are more effective at capturing dirt, which helps prevent cross-contamination of clean areas
- ✓ Mops with wringing and water removal systems make it easier to practice minimal water usage
- ✗ Cleaning large areas, such as storage rooms, can be time-consuming and require a significant amount of time to complete



Cleaning Machine

- ✓ Ideal for large areas, allowing extensive coverage quickly
- ✓ With a cleaning machine, intense physical effort is not required
- ✗ Requires a higher initial investment compared to other tools such as vacuum cleaners and mops



Methodology for Wall Cleaning

Soft Brush



- ✓ The soft brush facilitates effective removal of dirt from wall corners, ensuring adequate access to hard-to-reach areas.
- ✓ It is one of the best options for cleaning rack crevices, shelves, and inside the gondola price tag.



Lightly Damp Cloth, Broom, and Extension

- ✓ Recommended for use on walls with a lightly damp cloth, along with the broom and extension, to remove finer residues (dust, soot, etc.) and cobwebs



Methodology for Window Cleaning

Spatula and Rigid Brush



The spatula and rigid brush should be used when there is difficulty in removing dirt from windows, especially in cases of encrustation





If windows are equipped with pest entry protections, these should be removed initially. After removal, if they show dust accumulation, it is recommended to proceed with cleaning the protections.



Methodology for Rack Cleaning

Cleaning tools used

Vacuum Cleaner		Lightly Damp Cloth, Broom, and Extension

- ✔ Pallets on the lower levels of the racks (on the floor) should be removed to ensure complete cleaning
- ✔ The base of the rack is a critical and hard-to-reach area; therefore, it is recommended to use a vacuum cleaner to ensure effective cleaning in that location
- ✔ To remove finer residues (dust), use a lightly damp cloth on the structures of the racks



Methodology for Trash Can Cleaning

Cleaning tools used

Soft Brush		Water, Sponge, and Detergent

- ✓ Due to being a plastic structure, using water, sponge, and detergent facilitates cleaning
- ✓ It is recommended that cleaning with water be done from the outside of the warehouse



External Cleaning Methodology

The materials, tools, and methods for cleaning external areas may vary depending on the type of flooring and the environment (whether it has cement, grass, dirt, etc.). Generally, it is important to maintain a regular cleaning process to prevent excessive vegetation growth, which can lead to debris accumulation around the building and prevent pests from finding shelter, food, water, or entry points





All collected waste must be disposed of properly in a trash can. Additionally, brooms, vacuum cleaners, and mops must be cleaned and properly sanitized after each use



Any waste and spills must be cleaned immediately and disposed of properly. A **"clean yourself"** policy complements routine cleaning.
